Amongst some of the criteria that U-High has met is that it has demonstrated high academic achievement; and met or exceeded state-determined accountability criteria.

#### **National Title I Distinguished Schools**

The National ESEA Distinguished Schools Program is a project of the National Association of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) Program Administrators (NAESPA) that publicly recognizes qualifying federally-funded schools for positive educational advances and the outstanding academic achievement of their students. The National Title I Distinguished Schools award has been presented to schools across the nation, but only two winners are chosen for each state.



November 13 was a historic day for West Point High School when the Unified Flag Football Team won the Division II AIA State Championship game against Valley Vista High School.

The Dragons quickly took the lead to finish with a score of 44-6. The winning touchdown came from sophomore Malik Harden.

The championship was played on the outdoor field at State Farm Stadium in Glendale. This is the first Unified Sport Championship win for the school and the District. The single elimination tournament consisted of three games.

WP Flag Football is taught by Karina Gibbons, Justina Carnahan, Mahogany Jimerson, Shannon Forman and student coach, Michael Perez. There are 10 players.

The TUHSD Unified Program is a partnership with Special Olympics of Arizona to provide courses that promote school-wide inclusion of students with intellectual disabilities and general education students. Unified classes in sports, PE, music and dance include both populations, where partners (general education students) and athletes (students with an intellectual disability) work together.

When flag football games are in play, there is a ratio of three athletes to two partners on the field at a time.

The team was well-supported by the school and West Point families. Athletes were sent off from campus by the marching band and flagline. Student government, Unified Dance and students from the autism and CARES program, cheered from the sidelines.

The crowd held homemade posters and were dressed in red and black as they cheered, "We are West Point and we are UNIFIED!"










# COMMITMENT DAY 2025











Fast, Convenient, and Easy



The Tolleson Union High School District has introduced a new FMX portal to simplify the process of submitting facility requests. This new system replaces email and phone submissions, allowing facility managers, technicians, and custodians to track time spent on tasks. Faculty can now file two types of requests: maintenance and schedule.

Maintenance requests cover repairs and operational needs, such as fixing a classroom door or setting up tables and chairs for an event. Schedule requests let faculty reserve district facilities, including classrooms and the district office, for events like conferences, athletic games, or community gatherings. These requests can be for one-time or recurring bookings.

The FMX portal streamlines communication, boosts operational efficiency and makes managing district facilities easier. Faculty are encouraged to use the portal to ensure timely service and better coordination across the district.

Our PR and Marketing team is here to serve and support all of the exciting projects and ideas that you have to promote and showcase our district. As the number of these projects continues to grow, we want to ensure our PR Team is dedicated to each task that is brought our way, and that your project or idea is given the valuable time and energy it deserves. 
