ABOUT



The Homeless Education Program ensures compliance with the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, which guarantees immediate school enrollment and educational stability for students experiencing homelessness. This law removes barriers to education and connects families to school and community resources that support academic success and overall well-being.

QUALIFICATIONS

A Student May Qualify If They Are:

- In a shelter, motel, car, or inadequate housing
- Doubled-up due to hardship
- In temporary or unstable housing
- Without a parent or guardian (unaccompanied youth)

DISTRICT SUPPORTS

- Immediate enrollment without documents
- Free school meals, supplies, hygiene items, and clothing
- Transportation to/from school of origin
- Access to activities and support from the MV liaison

COMMON SIGNS

- Repeated clothing or poor hygiene
- Frequent absences, tardiness, or fatigue
- Mentions of moving often or unstable housing
- Signs of anxiety, withdrawal, or lacking supplies

YOUR ROLE

- Refer students to the site social worker or use the QR code/link to complete the McKinney-Vento Referral Form.
- Protect student privacy
- Be empathetic and discreet
- Offer extra care—students may be coping with trauma
