

Vision: We envision a community where every family has the tools and opportunities to flourish in education and society that will lead to positive social change for future generations.

FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER (FRC) TIMELINE

2022 

The idea for a Family Resource Center was introduced in response to community and student needs.

2022 

With the support of the board, planning efforts took place.

Summer & Fall

2022 

Research began to identify best practices and other resource centers.

Spring

2023

Stakeholder Input Feedback was gathered from families, staff, and community partners to guide planning.

2024 

Building Partnerships & Expanding Resources Efforts focused on strengthening partnerships and growing available supports for families.

2025 

The FRC Team presented an update and shared there has been a 97% increase in needs since 2023.

2026

TUHSD received a approval for a Family Resource Center building.





RESULTS: FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER FEATURES


