niversity High School (UH) is a free college prep high school in the Tolleson Union High School District.


The Title 1 school serves traditionally under-represented students and families. Approximately 60% of our students qualify for free/reduced lunch.

UH is a school-within-a-school, sharing buildings, programs, opportunities and resources with Tolleson Union High School. Our students participate in a variety of sports and clubs. The athletic program includes students from UH and Tolleson Union, embodying a collaborative spirit competing at the 5A/6A level across multiple sports. Tolleson Union staff teach our diverse elective courses. All core classes are at the advanced, Pre-AP or AP level taught by highly qualified University teachers. There were 77 graduates in the Class of 2025.

Transportation is provided to students who live within the Tolleson Union High School District boundary.

Grading Policy

University High utilizes a semester-based cumulative GPA that is based on a 4.0 scale starting freshman year. However, standardized grades for Advanced courses are placed on a 5.0 scale. All courses taken are utilized in calculating a student’s GPA. To ensure parity as a district college-prep magnet school, University High School does not rank its students.
