In its inaugural year, West Point High School's SPARK program achieved remarkable success. All participating students — 100% — reported building positive connections with both peers and staff. Our Family Engagement events drew over 279 families, and 31 staff members actively contributed to after-school programming. Nearly 1,400 students attended the program at least once, with more than 200 students participating for 30 days or more. The SPARK program successfully met all of its goals for the 2024-2025 school year, and we look forward with excitement to its continued growth and impact.
