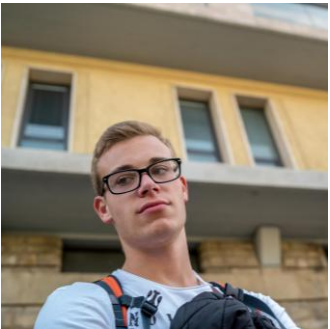

2026 KEYS RESEARCH INTERNSHIP

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Prior to engaging in research, KEYS interns complete assignments focused on science literacy, data science, and biotechnology between April and the start of the program in June.

The first week of the internship, otherwise known as training week, is a crash course that provides practical applications of the skills learned in their pre-KEYS assignments to ensure that have the base knowledge necessary to begin their assigned projects.

KEYS interns work with paired U of A researchers spearheading innovative projects that span multiple disciplines. Faculty, university students, and other lab personnel mentor interns to provide an invaluable opportunity to these budding scholars.

At the close of the program, KEYS interns present what they have learned and experienced to friends, family and the academic community at the research showcase.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Camp Cronkite, our summer enrichment media camp, allows high school students to dive headfirst into media right here at the Cronkite School. By day, Cronkite faculty, staff and student guides lead campers in hands-on learning in our state-of-the-art building on ASU's Downtown Phoenix campus; then, campers enjoy scheduled evening programming and end the day retreating across the street to Gordon Commons, our residential hall, for supervised R&R.

Students attend core sessions on writing, interviewing, visual storytelling and professional branding, and choose their own Camp Cronkite adventure by selecting elective sessions from topics such as producing, videography, podcasting, weather, social media and more.

Achieving a College Education

Ace students are high school juniors and seniors currently enrolled in college courses while attending regular high school. Throughout their junior and senior years, ACE students receive college scholarships so they can take classes at EMCC and experience the college environment.

Classes meet during the regular summer sessions and on Saturdays during the Fall and Spring semesters.

Upon graduating from high school, an ACE student will have earned up to 24 transferable college credits.

HOOP OF LEARNING

Hoop of Learning

The Hoop of Learning Program is an early high school bridge program created to encourage students to stay in school and graduate as well as increase their matriculation to college. A basic tenet of the Hoop of Learning program is the belief in the importance of young people developing strong positive cultural identities and integrity. To this end, culturally relevant curriculum is particularly important to this program and students are asked to take classes that focus on Native American history and cultural themes. Native American high school students, grades 9th through 12th, are given the opportunity to earn college credits while still in high school.

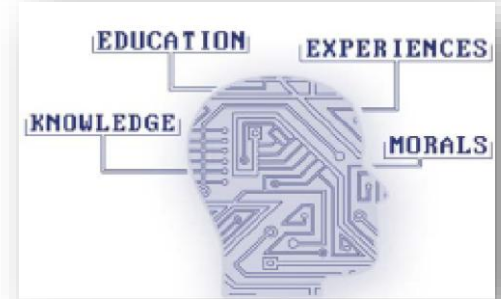

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Joaquin Bustoz Math-Science Honors Program is a summer residential program for high school students to begin mathematics studies before graduating high school. Students are registered in a university-level mathematics course for credit and there is **no cost to the student**. The JBMSHP offers a number of resources available to the students as they transition from high school to college. While the JBMSHP alumni are still enrolled in high school, they receive frequent electronic correspondence from the JBMSHP staff members ranging from a variety of topics including scholarship opportunities, assistance with college admissions, as well as prospects with regard to financial aid. Once JBMSHP alumni have matriculated to ASU, the JBMSHP continues to support and encourage these students to maintain high academic standards as they pursue their educational and career choices.

CISNEROS HISPANIC LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Caminos al Futuro is a fully funded, pre-college and residential summer program led by The George Washington University's Cisneros Institute. To be eligible, you must be a rising senior at a U.S. high school with a high-level of academic achievement and a demonstrated commitment to leadership.

During the 3-week intensive program, Caminos scholars live on the GW campus and examine the social, economic and political transformations affecting the Hispanic/Latino community in a college-like environment.

Participants get a first-hand view of policymaking in the nation's capital with visits to Congress, government agencies and leading non-profits. Scholars also participate in university-style lecture series, writing labs, and community action projects, meet with admissions specialists in a series of workshops to prepare them for the college application process.
