Attendance Improvement – State Attendance Liaison

Purpose of the Position: The Attendance Improvement State Attendance Liaison will provide targeted support to school districts, charter schools, and educational partners within an assigned region to improve student attendance, reduce chronic absenteeism, and strengthen engagement strategies. The liaison will serve as a support between the State Public Education Department (PED) and local education agencies (LEAs), ensuring alignment with state attendance improvement policies, guidance, and best practices.

Key Responsibilities

- Technical Assistance: Support identified non-grant LEAs in developing, implementing, and monitoring Attendance Improvement Plans (AIPs).
- **Program Support:** Support Safe and Healthy School Bureau in facilitating workshops and professional development on evidence-based attendance strategies to include restorative justice practices; trauma informed practices; safety and school climate.
- **Data Monitoring:** Analyze attendance data, align benchmarks with 40-day reporting cycles, and guide data-informed strategies.
- Collaboration: Coordinate with community partners, state programs, and LEA district attendance teams, family engagement team to address root causes of absenteeism via monthly communities of practice or site visits.
- Compliance: Monitor targeted LEA adherence to state attendance laws and reporting requirements.
- **Documentation:** Maintain monthly TA logs, prepare progress reports, and submit required deliverables.
