**UNDERSTANDING STATE TESTS...(RISE)** 

"We understand that state test results represent only part of the picture, but

While the test doesn't fail a student or block advancement in grades 3-8, the results still carry an indirect personal stake that is essential for them to understand.

- M Individualized Support: The data helps parents, teachers, and counselors identify a student's specific strengths and weaknesses.
- Accurate Placement and Pathways: The RISE scores provide crucial diagnostic data that is used by the school to make decisions about a student's educational trajectory, particularly in the transition to high school. Low proficiency scores can indicate that a student may need remediation, intervention, or placement into specific foundational courses in 9th grade to catch up.
- **Predictor of Future Success:** Proficiency on the RISE test in middle school subjects is an important indicator of a student's readiness for advanced coursework (like Algebra I) and their predicted performance on later highstakes exams, such as the ACT or SAT, which

do have direct consequences for college admissions and scholarships.

#### **Connection for School:**

The nature of the RISE test is centered on accountability and funding.

- # The RISE test is Utah's mandated assessment that measures student proficiency in core subjects (Math, ELA, Science) against the Utah Core Standards, as required by federal law.
- School Grading and Ranking: The overall test scores are a major component used to evaluate, rate, and rank schools across the state. Low scores can trigger interventions, sanctions, or mandates for improvement plans.
- Resource Allocation: School and district performance data influence how educational resources, funding, and support are distributed or directed towards specific schools for remediation and improvement programs.
- Curriculum and Instruction: Test results are used by administrators and teachers to analyze student performance gaps and guide curriculum changes, instructional strategies, and teacher professional development.23
- Essentially, the test is for the educational system in Utah because it serves as measure of whether schools are effectively educating students to the state standard.
