Titusville Middle School students were buzzing with excitement on Friday, October 3, as they took part in the first ever **Bee Day**, a hands-on science event dedicated to exploring the amazing world of honeybees. Throughout the day, students rotated through a variety of engaging activities designed to deepen their understanding of bees and their importance to our environment.

From **Bee Flight** experiments that explored the science of aerodynamics to a **Pollination** station where students learned how bees help plants grow and reproduce, every activity connected science with real-world applications. The **3D Bees** station gave students a chance to combine creativity with biology as they painted their own models of bees, while the **Escape Room** challenged participants to use problem-solving skills to "save the hive."

Students also took a step back in time during **Honey History**, discovering how humans have relied on bees for centuries. The highlight for many was a visit from "The **Bee Lady"**, who shared fascinating facts about bee behavior and hive life. Students also tried their hands at **Candle Making**, using wax to craft their own take-home souvenirs.




## Eighth Grade Artists Transform Ceilings into Canvases
