Senior Info

Being prepared and meeting deadlines is a huge factor for your Senior year. All Seniors who are planning on continuing their education whether to a 2 year, 4 year, trade or technical school, should be applying for scholarships online or with Mrs. Aguilar in the Counseling Office. Scholarships are for everyone. If you are planning on attending college, please check with the Counseling Office to make sure that all your information is current as GPA's are forwarded electronically to the State for the Cal Grants. Also be sure to start gathering all your information for your resume which most scholarships request. Your resume should include activities, community service, awards/honors, events, etc. that you have participated in your high school career.

Senior Attendance

TJUHS Administrative Regulation for Senior Attendance: Tulare Joint Union High School District has implemented an attendance policy that must be met during



the senior year for participation in commencement ceremonies. 1. Seniors must not have more than thirty (30) period absences throughout the senior year in order to be eligible to participate in the commencement ceremonies. Seniors that have more than 30 period absences will still graduate and receive a diploma but will not be part of the commencement ceremonies. 2. This is not an excused/unexcused absence policy. It is an attendance policy. Any absence will be counted against the thirty (30) period absence requirements with the following exceptions: a. Doctor appointment or doctor mandated stay at home b. Subpoenas to court c. Funeral for an immediate family member d. Participation in a school activity (there will be a 2-day total college visitation maximum allowance) 3. It is up to the student to bring verification from the doctor or court for an exception. Otherwise the absence will count against the policy. Verification must be brought within five (5) school days upon the return of the absence. 4. The Governing Board of any high school, or unified school district may maintain classes on Saturday. The School District's Board of Education approves such classes when appropriate and practicable. The classes may include **MAKE-UP CLASSES FOR UNEXCUSED ABSENCES** occurring during the week. Attendance at classes conducted on Saturday shall be at the election of the pupil or, in the case of a minor pupil, the parent or guardian of the pupil. Saturday School attendance (all four hours) may clear an absence. Banking of Saturday School credit is **NOT** allowed.

Back to School Night is August 26 activities will begin at 5:30 p.m., classes will open at 6:30 p.m. Your child will be dismissed from school at 1:05 that day. We thank you for taking an active role in your student's educational process.

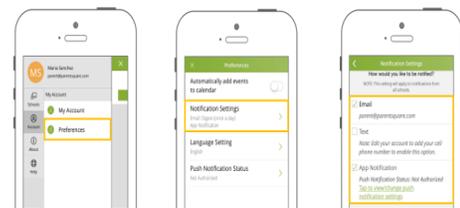

Class Schedules and Modified Closed Campus Policy

Class Schedules

Seniors, Juniors and Sophomores will be able to access their class schedules online using their Chromebook or phone. Reminder: Student ID cards will be available digitally on your phone. Freshman will receive their class schedules during **Freshman First Flight on August 8**. If you are unable to access your schedule online, or did not receive it, you can pick it up on the **first day of school —Thursday, August 14th — from 7:45 am to 8:30 am in front of the gymnasium**. Let's start the year off right and be prepared!

Schedule Changes

Please take a moment to review your student's class schedule. The courses listed should reflect the academic plan developed with their Counselor. **Schedule changes may be made during the first two weeks of school only.** After that deadline, no further changes will be allowed. If you have any concerns about your student's schedule, attendance, or personal issues, their Counselor is available to help. Counselors can also provide information about careers, scholarships, and school-related activities. To find your student's Counselor, please login to your Aeries Parent Portal. If you need assistance, please **email or call your student's Counselor to schedule an appointment.** We're here to support your student's success!

Modified Closed Campus Policy

It is district policy to notify parents and guardians of Mission Oak High School modified closed campus plan at the



beginning of each school year. Currently, the policy states that freshman and sophomores shall remain on campus during the lunch hour unless permitted to leave by the school administration. Juniors and seniors who are in "good standing" are allowed to go off campus during the lunch break. The good standing criteria is based upon the student's behavior, academic performance, and their school attendance. Eleventh and twelfth grade students who have more than 30 class period absences or who are facing school discipline may have their off campus privilege suspended. Regarding academic performance, students that have more than one D or one or more F's at the most recent grading period, will be considered ineligible for off campus privileges until the next grading **period** when academic progress will be reviewed again. In order for juniors and seniors to receive off-campus privileges during lunch, juniors and seniors must also maintain a minimum progress toward meeting the

high school graduation requirements prescribed by the Board. Minimum progress toward graduation shall include all courses taken by the student and be based on the following: Juniors-- Accumulate 100 units by the beginning of the first semester of the junior year, or accumulate 130 units by the beginning of the second semester of the junior year; Seniors--Accumulate 160 units by the beginning of the first semester of the senior year, or accumulate 190 units by the beginning of the second semester of the senior year. The governing board of the Tulare Joint Union High School District, pursuant to Section 44808.5 of the Education Code, has decided to permit the pupils in good standing enrolled at Mission Oak High School to leave the school grounds during the lunch period. Section 4408.5 of the Education Code further states: "Neither the school district nor any officer or employee thereof shall be liable for the conduct or safety of any pupil during such time as the pupil has left the school grounds pursuant to this section."

Dress Code

Dress Code Information For High School Students

Our district campuses encourage students to dress appropriately for school and enforce a dress code for all high school students. Research has shown that student dress and appearance affect student attitude and conduct and that appropriate grooming and dress are a part of the learning process. We understand that students and their parents freely choose a style of dress that reflects the student's individuality, but we also believe that there are standards of appropriateness in grooming so not to distract from the educational process. If you have any questions regarding the dress code policy, please contact the high school administration at your convenience. It is important to note that the dress code shall apply at school and at all school-sponsored activities. The following guidelines are intended to define appropriate student attire:

- Student dress and appearance shall not be disruptive/hazardous to the safety of anyone in the school.
- Any clothes or styles of dress that may cause a threat, have a negative effect, or disrupt the educational process will not be permitted.
- No student may wear clothing that contains words that are suggestive or has suggestive double meanings of lewdness, obscenity or vulgarity.
- Clothing advertising alcohol, drug or



- tobacco products is prohibited.
- Any apparel, jewelry, accessory, notebook, backpack, or manner of grooming, which, by virtue of its color, arrangement, trademark or any other attribute, denotes membership in gangs, advocates drug use, violence, disruptive behavior or is offensive is prohibited. A behavior contract is enforced based on gang associated activities.
- See-through, midriff, fishnet blouses, spaghetti strap tops (straps must be one 1 1/2" or wider), low cut, revealing tops and muscle shirts that are cut low under the arm are prohibited.
- Shirts must be worn at all school activities including sporting events. Bare midriffs will not be allowed.
- All shorts and skirts must be an appropriate length, mid-thigh or longer. Biker shorts shall not be worn as outer garments.
- Bandannas are not allowed at school or at school-sponsored events.
- Towels, T-shirts, folded shirts or any other clothing article cannot be worn around the neck, draped over the shoulder, or hanging from the pocket.
- No lanyards hanging from pocket.
- Hats are not permitted on campus. This includes, but is not limited to, baseball-style hats, knit caps, beanies (are only permitted from Nov. 1 to March 1), bandannas, hair nets, and hoods.
- For sun protection, students are allowed to wear a full brim hat that is constructed

of cotton or canvas material, capable of being folded up while in the classroom. These hats must be: Free of any type of logo or writing, Solid white or khaki color, Removed upon entering building.

- No bagging or sagging clothes are permitted. Pants must fit at the waist, hips, crotch and thighs. Belts must be tucked into the pant loops.
- Wallet chains are prohibited.
- Shoes must be worn at all times.
- Sports Jerseys are not allowed on campus other than those with district/ school logos (Effective 2014-2015). The Tulare Joint Union High School District encourages students to dress appropriately for school. All clothing shall be neat, clean and acceptable in repair and appearance and shall be worn within the bounds of decency, safety, and good taste as deemed appropriate by school administration. Please use the guidelines of acceptable and not acceptable when purchasing back to school clothing.

For returning bus riders, please be at your previous bus stop 15 minutes earlier than last year until we make the necessary additions and drops to our bus routes. The bus driver will be communicating with the students of updated times and locations for their bus stops.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

If a student does not appear more than three (3) days in a row at their assigned bus stop, the student will be dropped from the route. If the student will be out for more than three (3) days in a row, please contact the Transportation Department or inform the driver so the student will not be dropped from the route.

Students will not be allowed to get off at an unauthorized stop without a prior parental/guardian permission slip approved by the school attendance office.

Seat belt use if equipped on buses by law is mandatory at all times when the bus is in motion. This will be enforced.

Please note that students who receive permission to attend a school outside their attendance area must provide their transportation to and from school.

Modificado Cerrado Política del campus

Es política del distrito notificar a los padres y tutores sobre el plan de campamento escolar cerrado modificado de la Escuela Secundaria Mission Oak al comienzo de cada año escolar. Actualmente, la política establece que los estudiantes de primer y segundo año permanecerán en el



campamento escolar durante la hora del almuerzo a menos que la administración de la escuela les permita salir. Los estudiantes de tercer y cuarto año que están en "buena reputación" pueden salir del campamento escolar durante la hora del almuerzo. El criterio de buena reputación se basa en el comportamiento del estudiante, el rendimiento académico y su asistencia a la escuela. A los estudiantes de undécimo y duodécimo grado que tengan más de 30 ausencias en periodos de clase o que se enfrenten a medidas disciplinarias escolares se les puede suspender el privilegio de salir del campus. Con respecto al rendimiento académico, los estudiantes que tengan más de una D o una o más F en el período de calificación más reciente no serán considerados elegibles para los privilegios fuera del campus hasta el próximo período de calificación cuando se revisará nuevamente el progreso académico. Para que los juniors y seniors reciban privilegios fuera del campamento escolar durante el almuerzo, los juniors y seniors también deben mantener un progreso mínimo para cumplir con los requisitos de graduación de la escuela secundaria prescritos por la Junta. El progreso mínimo hacia la

graduación deberá incluir todos los cursos tomados por el estudiante y se basará en lo siguiente: Juniors: acumular 100 unidades al comienzo del primer semestre del tercer año, o acumular 130 unidades al comienzo del segundo semestre del tercer año. tercer año; Seniors--Acumular 160 unidades al comienzo del primer semestre del último año, o acumular 190 unidades al comienzo del segundo semestre del último año. La junta directiva del Distrito Escolar Unificado Conjunto de Escuelas Secundarias de Tulare, de conformidad con la Sección 44808.5 del Código de Educación, ha decidido permitir que los alumnos con buenos antecedentes inscritos en la Escuela Secundaria Mission Oak abandonen los terrenos de la escuela durante el período del almuerzo. La Sección 4408.5 del Código de Educación establece además: "Ni el distrito escolar ni ningún funcionario o empleado del mismo será responsable por la conducta o la seguridad de ningún alumno durante el tiempo que el alumno haya abandonado los terrenos escolares de conformidad con esta sección.

Código de vestimenta

Información sobre el código de vestimenta Para estudiantes de secundaria

Los campamentos escolares de nuestro distrito animan a los estudiantes a vestirse apropiadamente para la escuela y hacen cumplir un código de vestimenta para todos los estudiantes de secundaria. Las investigaciones han demostrado que la vestimenta y la apariencia de los estudiantes afectan la actitud y la conducta de los estudiantes y que el aseo y la vestimenta adecuados son parte del proceso de aprendizaje. Entendemos que los estudiantes y sus padres eligen libremente un estilo de vestimenta que refleje la individualidad del estudiante, pero también creemos que existen estándares de idoneidad en el arreglo personal para no distraer la atención del proceso educativo. Si tiene alguna pregunta sobre la política del código de vestimenta, comuníquese con la administración de la escuela secundaria a su conveniencia. Es importante tener en cuenta que el código de vestimenta se aplicará en la escuela y en todas las actividades patrocinadas por la escuela. Las siguientes pautas están destinadas a definir la vestimenta apropiada de los estudiantes:

- La vestimenta y la apariencia de los estudiantes no deben ser perjudiciales / peligrosas para la seguridad de nadie en la escuela.
- No se permitirá ninguna ropa o estilo de vestir que pueda causar una amenaza, tener un efecto negativo o interrumpir el proceso educativo.
- Ningún estudiante puede usar ropa que contenga palabras sugerentes o con doble significado sugerente de lascivia, obscenidad o vulgaridad.
- Se prohíbe la ropa que publicite productos de alcohol, drogas o tabaco.



- Se prohíbe cualquier prenda, joyería, accesorio, cuaderno, mochila o forma de arreglo personal que, en virtud de su color, arreglo, marca comercial o cualquier otro atributo, denote membresía en pandillas, defienda el uso de drogas, violencia, comportamiento perturbador o sea ofensivo. Se hace cumplir un contrato de comportamiento basado en actividades asociadas con pandillas.
- Se prohíben blusas transparentes, de cintura baja, blusas de rejilla, blusas con tirantes finos (las correas deben ser de 1 1/2" o más anchas), blusas escotadas, blusas reveladoras y camisas con corte bajo debajo del brazo.
- Se deben usar camisas en todas las actividades escolares, incluidos los eventos deportivos. No se permitirán diafragmas desnudos.
- Todos los pantalones cortos y faldas deben tener una longitud adecuada, a la mitad del muslo o más. Los pantalones cortos de motociclista no se deben usar como prendas exteriores.
- No se permiten pañuelos en la escuela o en eventos patrocinados por la escuela.
- Las toallas, camisetas, camisas dobladas o cualquier otra prenda de vestir no se pueden usar alrededor del cuello, colgando del hombro o colgando del bolsillo.
- Sin cordones colgando del bolsillo.
- No se permiten sombreros en el campus. Esto incluye, entre otros, sombreros estilo béisbol, gorros tejidos, gorros (solo se permiten del 1 de noviembre al 1 de marzo), pañuelos, redcillas para el cabello y capuchas.

Proceso de Confirmación de Datos

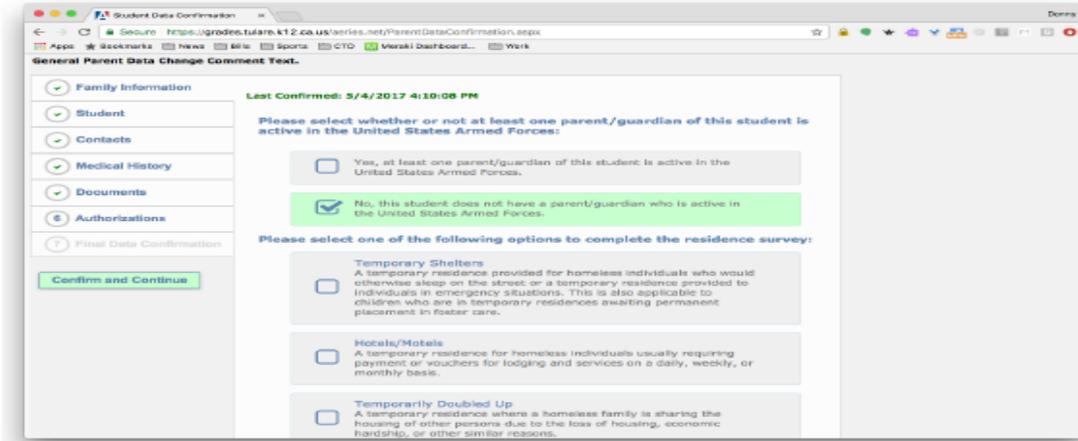

- 2) Si se abre una ventana activa de cambio de datos, aparecerá el siguiente mensaje:

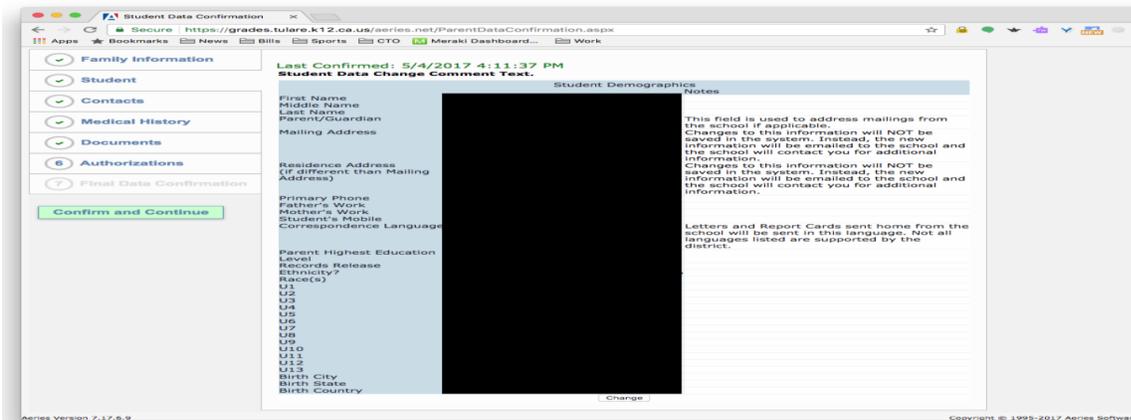

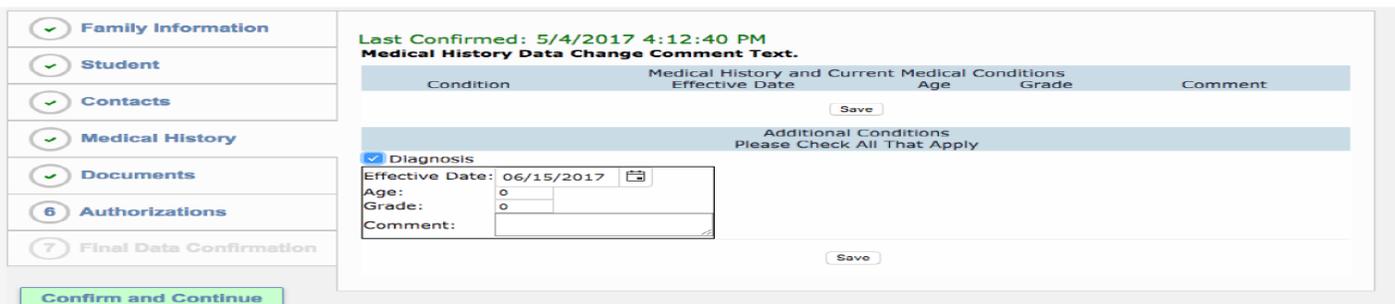
