



SAP Program: A Guide for Parents/ Guardians

What is SAP?

The Student Assistance Program (SAP) can help children experiencing barriers to learning. In Pennsylvania, every school district is required to have a plan for identifying and assisting students who experience barriers to learning. Our school's Student Assistance Program team name is the SAP Team.

The Dassa McKinney Elementary School SAP team will help you find services and assistance within the school, and if needed, in the community. We do not diagnose, treat, or refer your child for treatment. We will provide you with information and you make the choice(s) that best fit your needs and wishes. As the parent/guardian you are an important part of the team.

Do You See Your Child Showing Any of These Behaviors?

- Withdrawing from family, friends, and/or activities
- Changing friends
- Unexplained physical injuries
- Feeling sad
- Talking about suicide
- Defying authority, both at home and school
- Acting aggressively
- Hitting
- Lying
- Needing money without a good explanation
- Declining grades
- Experimenting with alcohol or drugs
- Back-talking staff
- Pattern of inappropriate behaviors
- Are You Concerned About Your Child's Reaction To...?
- Recent death of a loved one
- Divorce of parents
- Family relocation
- A relationship problem
- Bullying
- Other traumatic event



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How Does My Child Become Involved in the SAP Program?

Anyone can refer a child to the SAP team. Some students are referred by teachers or other school personnel. A friend or family member can also let the SAP team know that they are worried about someone. The child can even go directly to a SAP team member to ask for help. Schools will gather information to determine how a student is doing in their classes. However, the SAP team will not proceed unless you give your written parent permission. Once permission is received, the SAP team will work with you to develop a plan of action to help your child achieve success in school. Participation in the program is voluntary.

What If Someone Has Referred My Child to SAP? The SAP Team Coordinator will contact you regarding your child's referral to the program. Before a SAP team member talks to your child, you will be asked to sign a permission form. The SAP team will work with you and your child throughout the process. As a parent, your knowledge and thoughts about your child will be helpful in developing a plan of action. If you need more information before making a decision about SAP, call your child's school and ask to speak to the SAP Team Coordinator, the school's guidance counselor.

How Do I Contact the SAP Team at Moniteau?

If you have any questions about SAP or you feel that your child may need help, call your child's school and ask to speak with the Moniteau School District SAP Team Coordinator, the school's guidance counselor.

Privacy The SAP team information is completely confidential and the team will respect you and your child's privacy at all times.
