#### **Annual Employee Recognition Celebration**




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## **Quentin Elementary School**

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

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



We continued with our Kids at Hope Celebration with Invite Your Aces to Lunch. On Thursday, many of the student's Aces came to lunch and enjoyed the day.





<u>Duet</u> - We currently ended our first workshop for school year 2014-2015 Powerful Families Workshop Series with Duet Partners in Health and Aging. Duet Partners in Health & Aging offers support to grandparents as they face different challenges. Their mission is to promote a safe home and better life for the grandchildren they are raising. Duet may help in support groups, educational workshops, social activities for families, benefit and legal guidance, monthly guardianship clinics, respite assistance, and resource information and referral.

Our grandparents were ecstatic and fully engaged in these past four weeks. The workshop helped build a strong relationship between grandparents and grandchildren. In addition, it allows grandparents to become involved with other families and learn how to build a valuable social support network. The next workshop will be scheduled for September. The topic will be Practicing Self Care.

<u>Nutrition Education Program</u> - Our Nutrition Education Program started on Monday, August 11<sup>th</sup>. The program is a six-week program and will end on September 22<sup>nd</sup>. The program is the Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program and is a federal grant program that teaches free adult nutrition classes to families in Maricopa County. The goal is to teach parents the importance of eating healthy, exercising, and helping them pass that knowledge on to their children.

<u>SNAP</u> - Our first SNAP appointment was on Thursday, August, 14<sup>th</sup>. We had several parents show up for their appointment and had a positive experience. The classes for school year 2014 began on August 7<sup>th</sup> and will go through September 18<sup>th</sup>. The classes are currently being held at the Welcome Center. The goal is to establish comfort and confidence in participating in school family events as well as daily living activities.
