The Littleton Elementary School District participates in the National School Breakfast and Lunch Programs to provide nutritious and affordable meals. Breakfast is free to all students.

Free & Reduced Meal Applications were available beginning July 1st, 2015 for this school year 2015/2016. If your child was approved during the prior school year for free or reduced meals and you wish to continue to receive those benefits, a new application is required every school year. Applications approved last year expire on August 28th, 2015. After that date, your child will return to full pay for lunch at \$2.45 each. If you have any questions, please call the Food & Nutrition Department at 623-478-5655 or 623-478-5627.

Breakfast and lunch includes a carton of milk. For students that bring their lunch, a carton of milk can be purchased for 30 cents.

You may pay with a check or cash for your child's lunches. Make the checks payable to your school or Littleton School District and include your phone number and your student's name.

You may also prepay for students meal accounts online at www.mySchoolbucks.com. Pre-payments are encouraged, as lunch service lines go more quickly with account rather than cash transactions. On-line payments may be set up by creating an account, adding the students, and making payments online. 

Teaching & Learning Services

The Teaching and Learning Department just completed DIBELS testing at all school sites with the assistance of the first Littleton Elementary School District DIBELS Testing Team. The team consisted of teaching and learning staff, reading interventionists and several retired teachers. The school deans did an amazing job of organizing materials for the team's arrival and the entire process ran very smoothly. The District was able to have all DIBELS testing completed within a two week window and individual schools were able to receive data for all K-3 students within a two day period. The team will meet again to complete testing in January and again in May. The DIBELS testing in K-3 is complete and data is entered. Teachers will now use this data to inform their reading instruction in whole and small groups. Using this data students will now be identified for intervention services as well as progress monitored according to their results. Thank you to *Ms. Kimberly Buckner* for overseeing the testing team and the Deans on each campus who ensured the testing team had the materials they needed to complete the testing.

The Benchmark Review Committee was reconvened this year as teacher input throughout the benchmark process is valued. This team, of teachers and Teaching and Learning staff, reviews the Kindergarten through eighth grade reading and math quarterly benchmarks to ensure the test questions align with the standards scheduled to be taught each quarter in our Beyond Textbooks curriculum. The process provides the committee an opportunity to discuss standards and appropriate test questions. This year the online benchmarks will include some technology enhanced questions to give 3-8 grade students the opportunity to answer online questions that are similar to what they will tackle when taking the AzMERIT test next spring. Thank you to the members of the Benchmark Review Committee for their time and dedication to this process.

On Wednesday August 19th Littleton ESD held the All District Professional Development Day. All Littleton ESD staff members attended professional development sessions related to their job duties. Some highlights of the day were: Defensive Driving, Customer Service, Number Talks, Instructional Routines, and Vocabulary Instruction. 


