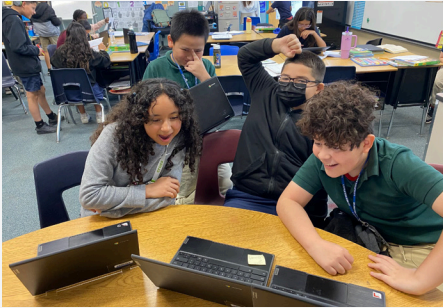

Mr. Durbin's 4th grade EL students were so excited to see that they were ranked 2nd on last week's Spring Stock Market Game leaderboard!



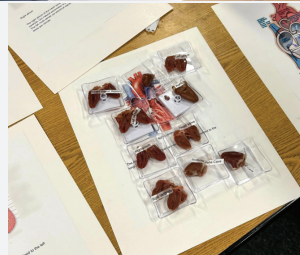

An EV student beamed with pride as she accepted the 2024 School Spirit Food Drive participation award for EV at Avondale city hall.



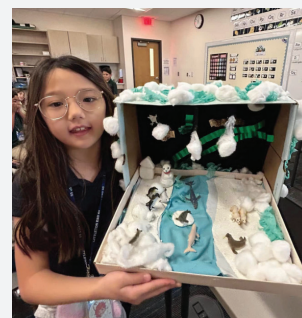
CASA Fieldtrip
